Develop knowledge about the trials of living and dying in Egypt, particularly the effect a royal death had on the society.</i>

Join in our drama session and experience how the Egyptians dispensed justice</p> <p>Ancient Games</p> <p>KQ: What can we do for leisure? What could children do? What skills would these games develop? What would they use to make games and why? How are these similar /different to what we play today?</p>

<p>Embalming and Mummification</p> <p>KQ: How do Egyptian beliefs impact on their everyday lives? Learn about some of the superstitions held by Ancient Egyptians when dealing with the dead</p> <p>Reflect & Review</p>
